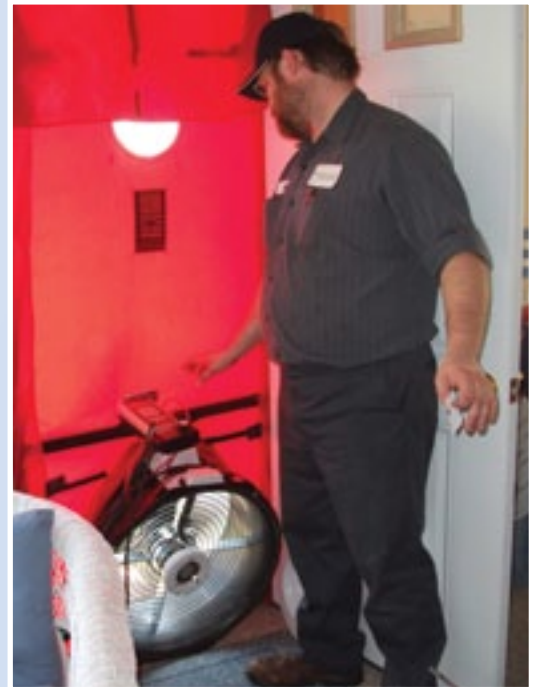

## Residential Programs – Helping Homeowners Save Money and the Planet

The Energy Efficiency Fund continued its efforts to help Connecticut residents have more control over their energy bill and reduce their carbon footprint through a number of programs and services. Whether that effort comes in the form of in-home energy assessments and weatherization improvements, discounted compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs), rebates on ENERGY STAR®-qualified appliances, or even providing incentives for the construction of new high-performance homes, the Energy Efficiency Fund is committed to improving the energy performance of Connecticut homes.

### 2010 Residential Highlights

- 34,296 participants served through the Home Energy Solutions program
- 15,347 participants served through the Home Energy Solutions-Income Eligible program
- 650 new energy-efficient homes built
- 5,282,491 discounted CFLs sold
- 7,798 HVAC and geothermal system rebates
- 608 natural gas water heater rebates





## Business & Municipal Programs – The Economic Engine of Connecticut

Whether it is for the retrofit of existing buildings or new construction, the Energy Efficiency Fund offers a wide range of programs designed to reduce the cost of doing business in Connecticut for all businesses and municipalities – large or small.

In 2010, 4,181 businesses and municipal buildings were constructed or retrofitted with new, energy-efficient technologies and equipment. By helping businesses and municipalities drive down their electricity and natural gas usage, businesses lower overhead and increase profits, and enable its municipalities to spend tax dollars on programs that help its citizens.

### 2010 Business & Municipal Highlights

- 161.7 million kilowatt-hours saved
- 1,886 participants in the Small Business Energy Advantage program
- 804 participants in the Energy Conscious Blueprint program (new construction and equipment)
- 1,355 participants in the Energy Opportunities program (existing buildings)

The energy-efficient measures installed by businesses and municipalities in 2010 will result in a savings of nearly \$326.3 million over the lifetime of their use.



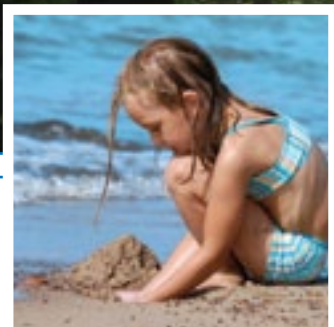

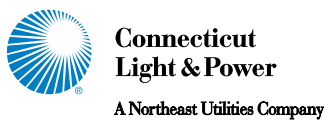
